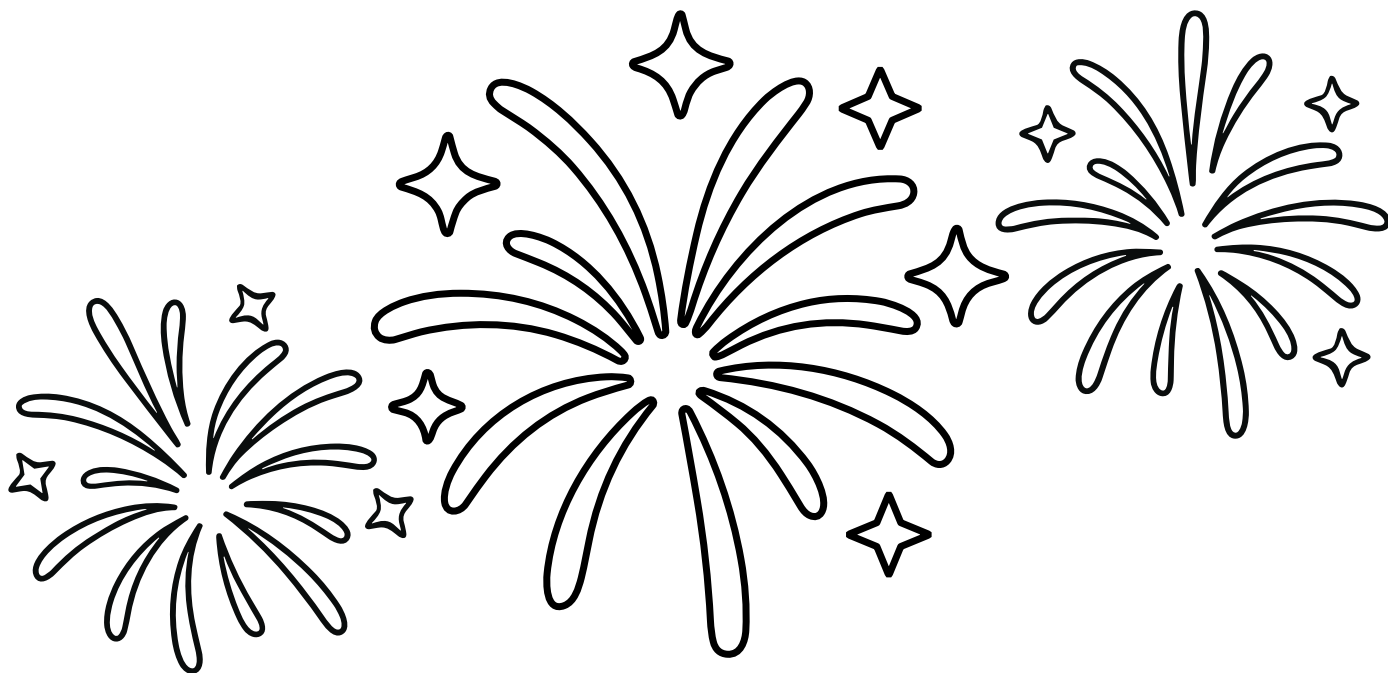

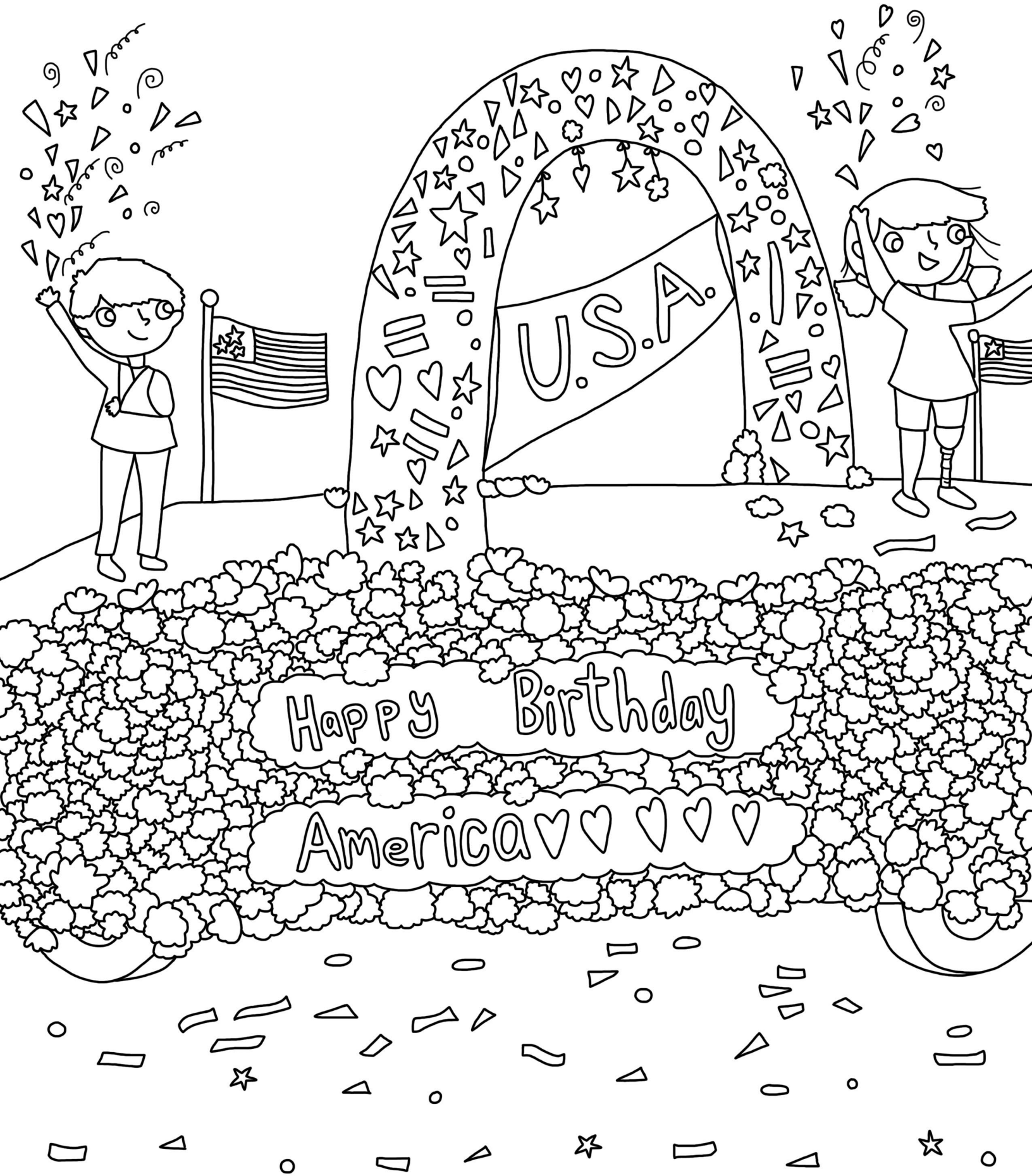
Fireworks on Display!

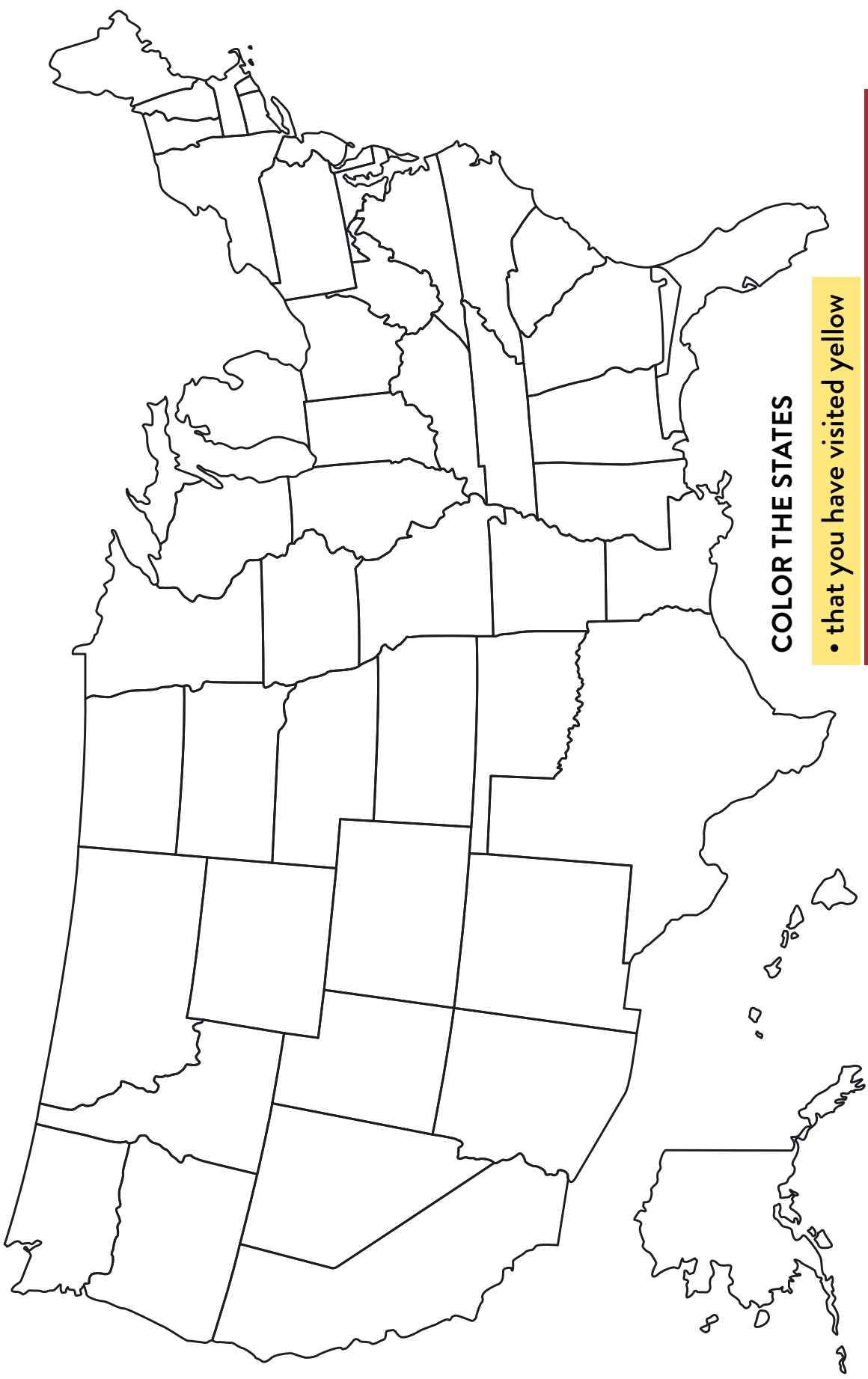

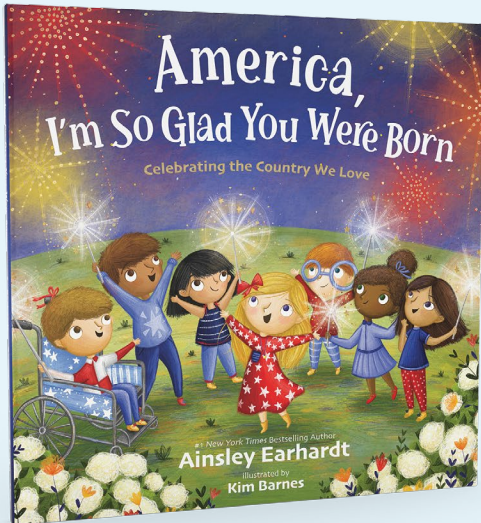
